# Rewards

## Bronze

- The club/society can reaffiliate for the next academic year, failure to achieve the bronze level will mean your affiliation to the union is reviewed
- You can bid for up to £50 of funding from the union outside of essential funds required to exist
- 1 training session booking
- 1 instructor/coach
- Bronze logo on marketing

## Silver

- You can bid for up to £150 of funding from the union outside of essential funds required to exist
- Entered into £100 prize draw for unrestricted funds
- You can be nominated for club/society of the year
- Club/Society execs can receive coaching/first aid/other external training
- Can book up to two training sessions
- Club/Soc spotlight on e-mail

## Gold

- You can bid for £500 of funding from the union outside of essential funds required to exist
- Entered into £200 prize draw for unrestricted funds
- Automatically entered for club/society of the year
- Priority access to room bookings for union only spaces
- Club/Soc Spotlight on all our social media for one week

# Engagement

- All activities are registered with the union
  - Engage with RAG month
- Promote the Students' Union elections through all social media channels and directly to your members
  - Help to support a Students' Union/Sabbatical Officer campaign
- One member from a club or society to attend the union elections debate or for the club/society to submit a question to candidates/promote the live stream on social media
  - Cultural and International Societies Participate in We Are Westminster Month
  - Help to support 2 x Students' Union/Sabbatical Officer campaigns

# Participation

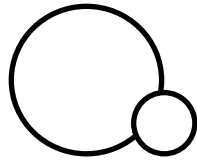
- Membership of at least 10 members registered on SUDB
  - Ran a democratic committee election, held an AGM and submitted minutes or held a union approved selection process
- At least 20 members registered on SUDB and maintain membership numbers from previous year
  - Take part in a national or inter-university event
  - Hosted two Give It A Go events
  - Undertake a membership recruitment initiative after Christmas
  - At least 5 members of your club/society are postgraduates
- At least 15 members registered on SUDB and maintain membership numbers from previous year
  - Hosted one 'Give it a Go' event
  - CPA Socs - Run one performance open and advertised to the public

# Activity

- Organised and promoted one non-alcoholic social event
- Organised at least one event per term for members
- Run one event as part of the Students' Union's RAG month
- Organised and promoted two non-alcoholic social events
- Run at least one event advertised as open to the entire student population
- Run a postgraduate focused networking/ careers event
- Course based Societies  
Run one employability focused event for your members
- Political/Ideological Societies  
Engage with any union run interfaith events or a local/national group relating to the soc's activity
- Political/Ideological Societies  
Host or take part in a debate relating to the societies aims/activity
- Organised and promoted three non-alcoholic social events
- Discussion/Political/Campaign Societies  
Plan and run a change campaign week in conjunction with the Students' Union
- Hosted an event as part of the SU/University Employability Month in February

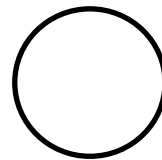
- Attendance at residential training

Collaborate/Perform with another society
- Prove development of your club/society based on your development plan
- Collaborate with multiple clubs or societies for activities or events
- Hosted an event in collaboration with similar student groups from other universities



- Signed and adhered to club/soc charter
- All required documents (room bookings, external speaker requests, team sheets, etc) submitted on time
- Attendance at each Club and Society Forum
- Check your club/society e-mail at least once a week
- Create and submit a club/society development plan at some point in the year
- Produced and implemented a handover for your new committee
- Attendance at additional training sessions
- Create a postgraduate specific role to be part of your committee

- Accurate content online on your page at the Students' Union website
- Booked and turned up to Freshers Fair stall (Academic socs the campus you are based at, all others at least one campus)
- Set up and use social media pages/twitter feeds
- Engage with Smoke Media to cover one of your events or your group
- Create a social media and marketing development plan

## Marketing



- All Club/Society funds kept in the Students' Union bank account
- All contracts signed by clubs/socs are approved in advance
- Raise at least 10% of your own funds in comparison to money granted to you by the union
- Charge a membership fee for your club or society
- Raise at least 20% of your own funds in comparison to money granted to you by the union
- Raise a minimum of £500 for the Students' Union's RAG charity of the year
- Raise at least 40% of your own funds in comparison to money granted to you by the union
